Herbal cannabis contains over 400 compounds including over 60 cannabinoids, which are aryl-substituted meroterpenes unique to the plant genus Cannabis. The pharmacology of most of the cannabinoids is largely unknown but the most potent psychoactive agent, 9 -tetrahydrocannabinol ( 9 -THC, or THC), has been isolated, synthesised and much studied.

For centuries Cannabis sativa and cannabis extracts have been used in natural medicine. Delta (9)-tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) is the main active ingredient of Cannabis. THC seems to be responsible for most of the pharmacological and therapeutic actions of cannabis. In a few countries THC extracts (i.e. Sativex) or THC derivatives such as nabilone, and dronabinol are used in the clinic for the treatment of several pathological conditions like chemotherapy-induced nausea and vomiting, multiple ...

The psychoactive effects of cannabis are largely attributable to 9 -tetrahydrocannabinol ( 9 -THC), the prototypical cannabinoid that occurs naturally in the plant. More recently, chemically- and pharmacologically-distinct synthetic cannabinoids (SCBs) have emerged as drugs of abuse. As compared to 9 -THC, the distinct structures of these compounds allow them to avoid legal restrictions (at least initially) and detection in standard drug screens.

Synthetic Cannabinoids: Pharmacology, Behavioral Effects ...

Chemical components of Cannabis, called cannabinoids, activate specific receptors throughout the body to produce pharmacologic effects, particularly in the central nervous system and the immune system. Commercially available cannabinoids, such as dronabinol and nabilone, are approved drugs for the treatment of cancer-related side effects.
